Pulling Weeds or Growing Seeds?

It was a gorgeous summer evening the perfect night for sitting on the front porch swing and surveying a job well done. She took a sip of her lemonade, and got up to take one last look at the yard before going into the house to get ready for bed. The marigolds smiled brightly, the daylilies burst forth their cheery yellow flowers, and the lavender was finally beginning to bloom. Everything was beautiful. She stepped around to the side yard, and felt her blood pressure dangerously rise. Weeds!?!

The bare patch on the side of the house had clearly been neglected. It wasn't visible from the driveway, or from the sidewalk to the front door. Nothing had been planted there, so she hadn't been visiting the side yard during her nightly flower-waterings. It was no surprise that the weeds had taken advantage of that strategic location. They reached out with their prickly little arms as if to say, "I dare you!" She took the dare. Putting on her leather work gloves, she rolled the large garbage can into place. After about an hour, she was exhausted, but victorious. The weeds were gone!

A few weeks went by, and once again, the side yard lay forgotten - forgotten by her, that is. The weeds remembered. She pulled them up again, and then did some research on her computer. She found that this weed - a type of thistle - was particularly resilient, and existed not as a single weed but as a network with deep and hearty roots. She would have to pull, pull, and pull some more. It was suggested that chemicals might be necessary to destroy the weed down to its root. Website after website, they all had one more suggestion in common: plant something to help block the growth of the thistle. In other words, she had to do more than just rely on her own efforts at removing the weeds - she had to help something grow in their place so that they could not do so any longer. Something else would have to be planted; something else would have to grow.

When faced with a particularly resilient sin (and aren't they all?), a Christian can be tempted to think that it is enough for her to pull, pull, and pull some more until the sin appears to be removed from her life. But is that really enough? We all know that appearances can be deceiving, and that danger often lurks in the roots just below the surface, waiting for us to lose sight and quite simply forget. We may think a sin is gone and forget to check the side yard for a few weeks, only to find that the sin is back yet again - or had it ever gone away in the first place? It is easy to overlook the corners of our lives, the inconvenient locations we don't often see, and think that there is no sin in those places. When the weeds are pulled, if nothing is planted, what remains is bare ground just waiting for something anything - to grow. What will grow in your bare ground?

Scripture, planted in us, has the power to cover over even the barest of places. I'm sure we all know all too well the places I mean in saying this. Just think about where you feel the most empty, the most fearful, and the most weak these are likely the same places at which the devil will take his most careful aim. The devil does not want us to notice his work at the corners of our lives, those inconvenient locations we don't often see. However, they may also be the very places where God most wants to touch our lives, for it is there that we can most clearly see just how desperate is our need for Him.

Although pulling weeds is still a good plan, it is clearly not enough. Seek to nurture the Word planted within you, and it will surely grow. It will cover your emptiness, your fear, and your need. It will cover you completely, just as surely as Christ has covered you with Himself now and forevermore.

Financial Update – June 2020

The church reopened for services in June under social distancing guidelines. The school year was completed via online classes.

For the month of June we ran a deficit of \$10 thousand, leaving us with a full year surplus of \$5 thousand. This compares to a \$10 thousand deficit we ran in our previous year.

Total receipts for the year were \$16 thousand higher than last year. Faith promise receipts were \$28 thousand higher than last year. Tuition receipts are \$23 thousand lower than last year. General fund memorials ran \$16 thousand higher than last year, while Thrivent receipts ran behind last year by \$3 thousand.

Spending for the full year was \$1 thousand higher than the previous year. Administrative spending was \$18 thousand higher than last year. Compensation and benefits spending was \$27 thousand higher than last year, but was partially offset by lower spending on debt payments and missions. Properties spending was \$15 thousand lower than the previous year. We benefited from a milder winter with lower heating costs and less snow removal. Capital projects spending was also reduced.

In early May, our loan application was approved for the Federal Government's Payroll Protection Program (PPP) forgivable loan program and we received a loan of \$144 thousand. During May and June approximately \$121 thousand of this loan was used to offset the costs of payroll, benefits and utility costs. The remaining \$23 thousand will be exhausted during July, and we will then file for loan forgiveness in August.

Our general checking account, which does not include PPP funds, had a \$55 thousand balance at the end of June. At the end of June 2019 our checking account balance was \$9 thousand.

During the month of June the memorial fund received contributions for capital projects and those who have recently passed from us.

Funds in the school technology account were transferred to the memorial fund at the end of June, as going into the new school year the church will be funding technology from tuition receipts. This account may also provide more visibility for potential gifts.

At the end of June funds were transferred from the general checking account to establish a rainy day fund, which will be used to cover emergencies, as agreed by voters.

A large payment was made out of capital projects to pay for replacing sewage lift pumps and a new control system for the heating and cooling systems. Both of these expenditures were approved by voters.
