

The Transfiguration of our Lord

As We Gather – Farewell to Alleluia Today we have reached a turning point in the Church Year. We leave the Christmas season and look forward to Easter. Before we can rightly celebrate Easter we will experience the forty days of spiritual renewal called "Lent." Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday. So today, Transfiguration Sunday, we put away the singing of "Alleluia." During the season of Lent we avoid singing "Alleluia" as a way to help us focus on the solemnity of Jesus' suffering and death on the cross for our sins. On Easter morning, when we celebrate our Lord's Resurrection, we will again sing "Alleluia" with joy and thanksgiving.





An explanation of what we believe as Lutheran

Formula of Concord, Solid Declaration, Article II, Free Will, 51,52

The eternal Father calls down from heaven about His dear Son and about all who preach repentance and forgiveness of sins in His name, "Listen to Him" (Matthew 17:5).

All who want to be saved ought to listen to this preaching. For the preaching and hearing of God's Word are the Holy Spirit's instruments. By, with, and through these instruments the Spirit desires to work effectively, to convert people to God, and to work in them both to will and to do [Philippians 2:13].

⁹When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Ask what I shall do for you, before I am taken from you." And Elisha said, "Please let there be a double portion of your spirit on me." ¹⁰And he said, "You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it shall be so for you, but if you do not see me, it shall not be so." ¹¹And as they still went on and talked, behold, chariots of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them. Mark 9:6 – "For he did not know what to say, for they were terrified." Soon enough, the disciples' terror turned into joy, for when Jesus is with us, there is no need to fear. He loves us and cares for us and will never abandon us. That assurance is the basis of all generosity — for only those who are set free from worry can learn the joy of giving.

THE LORD'S SUPPER is celebrated in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood (Matthew 26:26-28) to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their own detriment (1 Corinthians 11:28-30) and because Holy Communion is a confession of faith which is confessed at this altar, (1 Corinthians 10:16-18) any whom are not members, not yet instructed, or whom hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked to first speak with the pastor.

THE FRONT PEW ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE SANCTUARY is reserved during communion services for those whom have physical difficulty approaching the altar for communion. Communion services are held the second and fourth Sunday of each month. Please be seated in this pew if you want the pastor to bring you communion.


